Year 1 and 2 students had the opportunity to take part in two presentations from Kidsafe WA and the Royal Life Saving Society WA last month.

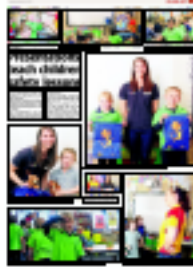
The presentations were designed to teach students about being safe at home and around water, using stories, songs and dance as a way to keep the sessions fun as well as educational.

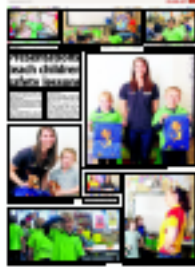

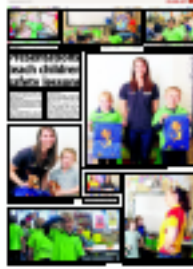
