



CUBBY HOUSES

- A cubby house can be a creative and imaginary play space for children. When purchasing and/or installing a cubby house:
- Ensure it is an appropriate size for young children including handrails.
- Ensure the fall height is no greater than 1.8m for 3 - 5 year olds.
- The design of the cubby should not allow children to climb onto the roof or surrounding structures.
- If the cubby is climbable then soft fall should be installed with a safe fall zone. All guardrails on the cubby structure should be vertical not horizontal with a recommended guard rail height of 900mm. This reduces the chance of a child climbing higher.
- Ensure that there are no sharp edges, splinters or entrapment areas on or within the unit
- A cubby at ground level reduces the risk of falls.



Cubbies don't have to be a traditional structure with a roof and doors. A more natural structure like a Mia Mia can be incorporated into your playspace and used as a cubby.
